Why does it matter?

- 1. Build support network
- 2. Expand with whom you can do research
- 3. Construct connections for future job and fellowship opportunities



How to do it?

- 1. Speak with your advisor and ask them to introduce you to scholars that they know
- 2. Ask other graduate students in your program to introduce you to people that they know
- 3. Identify before the conference scholars (i.e. professors and graduate students) that you'd like to met

Before the conference

- 2. Prepare business cards
 - a. University
 - b. Name (authorship)
 - c. Email address (personal/professional)
 - d. URL code



Before the conference

- 3. Volunteer at conference
- 4. Join FaceBook groups (AAAL graduate students, POC AAAL)
- 5. Befriend/follow scholars on social media



At the conference

1. Wear your badge ALL the time (right side)

Store business cards inside of your badge

- 2. Attend receptions and sessions
- 3. Talk with presenters after their sessions
- 4. Search for scholars during coffee breaks
